International governance of ecosystems, 7.5 hp

This course takes a macro-perspective on ecosystem management regimes. International law, different regimes, partnerships, institutional interactions, multi-level governance, global initiatives and social globalisation movements are analysed. Actors, underlying drivers, and normative perspectives are studied. A few case studies provide a historical and institutional context to the issues.
